Since the fund's inception in 1995 the committee has been able to reward 39 undergraduate members of Gamma Theta \$45,900 total

for their dedication and merit to the fraternity. "AT Ω is about true merit and what a brother is. Brian was involved in everything, well known, and well liked. He went through life with a huge smile and it was infectious," said Brian's brother-in-law **Bob Dudley '79**.

The decision to create this scholarship was easy. "It seemed like he need-

Brian's son, **Brandon**, is now a Gamma Theta pledge. **Brad Tolstedt '77** has remained in contact with Brandon since his father's passing. In a letter to Brandon on his 13th birthday Brad outlined Brian's greatest qualities.

"Your dad went the distance for friends in need, no questions asked. I remember one very late night when my car broke down 20 miles from the AT Ω house. I was stranded. Your dad was in bed and deep asleep. When

I called, he was there. No complaints. He got up and rescued me! He was just like that, always providing assistance, always going the extra mile."

Brian Keech will be remembered by many for his personality, sense of humor, and allegiance to friends and family. Through the scholarship fund, Brian's memory can carry on and influence lives for years to come.
