Undergraduate Juggles Responsibilities, Learns Valuable Lesson from Experiences Spotlight on Ted Elliott '09

Running your own mattress business isn't typically a job you think of when coming up with ways to make some extra cash during college, but **Ted Elliott '09** was up for the challenge. He heard about the idea from some friends who attend Texas Tech, met with the dealer



who coached him on how the program works, and then started his own branch in Lincoln.

"I buy my mattresses from a wholesaler, store them in a couple of storage units, and then post ads on Craigslist," Ted said. "I sell my mattresses lower than anyone else in town."

As a double major in accounting and finance, Ted not only juggles his tough course load and mattress business, but also his responsibilities as a third-year member of the Gamma Theta executive board.

"I was on the board during the hard years for Gamma Theta, so I had to take on a lot of responsibility, which made me grow up really fast," Ted said. "I learned how to balance being in charge while still being everyone's friend and peer."

Although Ted's experience on the board was a rollercoaster at times, he credits the struggles for bringing him and his brothers closer together. His advice to other members is to "get off to a good start with your grades so you can set the bar high and stay motivated to keep improving. It's easier to stay ahead then to try and climb to the top later."

After graduating this May, Ted plans to work as a summer intern for Deloitte Accounting Firm in Omaha. He then plans to return to Lincoln to get his master's degree in professional accounting. As for his mattress business: "I plan to still run it in graduate school and own it afterward, but let someone else in the fraternity do the selling." Q&A WITH KEN WEST '73

Q: Why did you decide to join Gamma Theta?

A: I lived in the dorms during my freshman year and then moved off campus my sophomore year with some of the guys I met my freshman year. I was not really enjoying the experience. I always felt like I was missing something. I wanted to be more involved in and be around campus activities. Don Nix, D.D.S. '72, who I played freshman basketball with, invited me to the chapter house for a Monday night dinner to meet other guys in the house and to watch the Muhammad Ali and Joe Frazier boxing match. It was great to be around a bunch of guys hanging out, laughing, and enjoying each others company. After that visit I knew I wanted to be a part of the Gamma Theta brotherhood. It's what I had been missing. I joined the chapter that next semester.

Q: What were some of your favorite memories as an undergraduate?

A: I'll never forget our east wing "munging" sessions. Around 10:30 or 11 p.m. many of us who lived on the east wing of the house on the second floor, along with other interested brothers, would get together and talk about current events, sports, political issues, current campus events, etc. We would get into some really interesting conversations and talk until the wee hours of the morning.

Q: Do you have any family members who are also Alpha Tau Omegas?

A: I have two brother-in-laws, Vance Jernstrom '74 and Ross Jernstrom '75, who are Gamma Thetas, which is actually how I met my wife, Valerie, who was a Tri Delta at UNL. Two of my sons, Jeff '01 and Andy '05, are also Gamma Thetas, as well as my nephew, Brett West '92. My father-in-law, Dr. Roger Jernstrom, South Dakota '49, was an AT Ω at the University of South Dakota. It's been great to share the AT Ω bond with all of them.

Q: What did you do after college?

A: I jumped right into work. After earning my bachelor's degree in architectural studies in 1976, I started working for an architectural firm in Omaha. For the past 31 years I have



worked for DLR Group, one of the top 10 largest architectural/engineering firms in the country. I was the Omaha office leader for 10 years and have been a principal in the firm since 1988. I'm now the Regional Marketing Leader and Corporate and Higher Education Sector Leader for the Central Region of DLR Group, which includes the Omaha, Lincoln, and Des Moines offices.

Q: What motivated you to get involved with the chapter as an alumnus?

A: A good friend of mine, **Bob O'Neal '71**, who serves as our house corporation president, asked if I would participate. That was 14 or 15 years ago. I said yes, and I've been on the board since then. Both of my sons have been in the house since I've been on the board.

Q: Why do you think it's important to support Gamma Theta?

A: You should give back to things that had an influence on your life. By supporting Gamma Theta, you are ensuring other young men have the opportunity to experience the same things you did as an undergraduate. It's also a way to stay connected with other brothers, past and present. By getting involved as an alumnus you develop a strong bond and new relationships. Plus, it feels good to give back!
