Officer Position for ATΩ Leads Brother to True Calling in Life Spotlight on Michael Stephens '88

When **Michael Stephens '88** reminisces on his undergraduate years, it's hard for him to choose a favorite memory. There are just so many. He loved participating in intramurals with his brothers, watching TV in the Tube Room, munching on Elli burgers on Wednesdays, and attending annual get-togethers like Lobster and Lowenbrau.

Michael was initially drawn to Gamma Theta for its reputation of academic and athletic success. What he gained as a member, though, was so much more. "The lessons I learned revolved around building relationships and having pride in how you represent yourself and your house," he said. "The basics of friendship, communication, trustworthiness, and loyalty were solidified during my four years at ATΩ."



After earning his bachelor's degree in business management from UNL in 1991, Michael went on to earn his master's degree in sports management from Western Illinois University in 1994. After college, Michael worked for the Omaha Royals for eight years before spending two years with the Kansas City Royals as manager of corporate sponsorship sales. In 2002, Michael became director of licensing for the UNL Athletic Department. He later added director of concessions and director of corporate marketing to his title in 2005 and 2007, respectively.

In addition to his previous roles, Michael was named assistant athletic director for UNL in 2009. His job is to lead marketing operations, including game-day promotions, ticket marketing, concessions, the Huskers Authentic Team Store, and the Spirit Squad.

His advice to undergraduates is to "get involved on campus as it will help you find your true interest and calling in life." His year as intramural chairman for ATΩ peaked his interest in sports and played a big role in his decision to pursue a career in the sports industry. He also urges undergraduates to enjoy each day and alumni to reach out to each other and reconnect.

"ATΩ is part of my life every day through memories and friends," he said. "Whether in the same city or spread out across the country, my brothers and I stay in touch. They are my lifelong friends."
